

Our Story

Thank you for your support.

We did not anticipate the casualty be this big and set out a low target... People in Nepal still need your help and we appreciate further support.

It is estimated 1 Million plus children are displaced and looking for shelter.

If you have contacts that can deliver tents from Europe, The Americas, Asia and Australia: Please get in touch as that is what we desperately need.

Live Update: 27th April.

We are busy organising the tents.

The design and material is modified so it's cheaper and quicker to build. Logistic is a nightmare as well as getting the materials. Nevertheless, we installed one huge tent in Chitwan medical college.

There are lots of victims from Lamjung who need shelter over there. Tomorrow we will get 10 canvas. We will leave to Gorkha the day after. We hope to install at least 10 canvas a day if everything works out.

Our village has been almost wiped out,” said Vim Tamang, a resident of Manglung, near the epicentre. “Most of our houses are either buried by landslide or damaged by shaking.” He said that half the village’s population was missing or dead. “All the villagers have gathered in the open area. We don’t know what to do.”

What is abari doing?

- Abari.org is currently making tents and will donate the canvas and bamboo tents. These tents will be used for medical camps and temporary accommodation.
- Abari will send these tent to the most affected areas- mainly Gorkha and Lamjung. The casualties in these places are unknown yet as it can take upto 2-3 days to get there. News is gradually coming out that 80% plus of the building are in ruins. It has been hard to get hold of people in Nepal, as the communication is not fully functional.

How can you support?

- Pakistani-administered Kashmir, 2005: 7.6

- Haiti, 2010: More than 220,000 people killed in 7.0 magnitude earthquake

We have 48 hours before our funding ends.. Please circulate this to your friends.

This has been their result so far in terms of supporting earthquake victims : Households reached: 3190, Individuals reached: 15, 546, Tarpaulins: 1308, Mattresses: 385, Blankets: 5766, Tents: 259, Cooked food rations: 4338 kg, Dry food: 102 cartons.

We have also provided transitional tents 5 schools.

It was Saturday and children were not in school and since it was during the day people could escape. Therefore, the number of dead and injured could have been worse.

The most urgent need, in areas where there were less casualties was to send tarpaulins - rest people could have managed on their own. Even that our government miserably failed. A week since disaster people are still desperate.

Our expertise is to make durable shelter and relief operation is not our forte. As we were planning on longer term solution, we got desperate calls from all over the country for immediate shelter. One call which I could not resist was from Giri Lamichane, school principle from Dhawa, Gorkha who I have known for years. We stopped all our projects and diverted all our 30 guys to make tents.

Bit of good news at last....

Abari landed three days ago against all odds in [Dhawa - 12 KMS](#) from the epicentre. 90% of the houses were destroyed.

We got there, looked at each other, didn't know where we were. We saw our local friends we smiled, how lucky we are.

The school, built by abari in Dhawa, for our friends ([Learning Planets](#)) is unscathed while the whole village has fallen down. It was among the few remaining shelters the villagers had.

We teamed up with them, it was time to build....

We started by constructing a large shelter for medical treatment. And then several smaller ones for shelter. Shelter by shelter, for all our friends without homes. All this in 3 days and with limited communication with the outer world!

We didn't do this on our own.

The locals, Believers (air support), ([Learning Planets](#)), medical staff, our friends around the world and the determination of young smart people working selflessly on the field.

We will continue our journey, a village at a time and work with the locals to build back the paradise.

The team is exhausted, we are tired and hungry but that is nothing compared to what the villagers are facing. We have a lot of stories to tell and photos to share.. Bear with us for a few days....

Team update - 30th April

[The team are currently in Dhawa which is 12 km from the epicentre.](#) The team includes medical staff, Abari crew and volunteers.

We have already built several tents which people are using as shelter. The demand for shelter is high, and materials are en route from Thailand and India. Due to congestion in the airport and custom clearance in the border, there has been some delay.

The only form of communication (if any) has been through SMS messages as there is limited internet facilities. As soon as we get photos we will update you. The place is remote.

Next steps:

As the monsoon is approaching in two weeks, there is an urgent need for support for building sanitation

facilities. The risk of potential diseases are high if the sanitation is not considered.

Friends of Abari across the globe are working on a design to build toilets using adobe, bamboos and canvas so the design can be passed to the people in the ground.

Tuesday 28th

Material have finally arrived for 25 odd tents. The team is heading to Gorkha with a group of doctors, a dozen volunteers and enough materials for 25 odd tents and food supplies.

Instead of carrying the poles for the tents, we will be using local bamboos in the region to erect the tent, significantly minimising the weight of the load.

We are expecting more tents in couple of days from Thailand, India and China.

Due to the lack of internet connection in the ground, we are struggling to update with photos.

The team is also struggling with lights and ways to charge the batteries..If any of you know contacts that can facilitate us buying solar/wind up chargers please get in touch..
